Without access to affordable, quality child care, children's learning is disrupted and parents face greater obstacles in their own work and learning. We also saw that delivering child care is complex, and especially during an extended emergency.

At Action for Children, we're determined to ensure that quality child care is accessible and affordable, every day, no matter what is happening in the world.

We support those who support our children; our goal is to help adults be the best parents and caregivers, child care providers, and educators they can be. We enable the success of those who prepare our children for success.

INNOVATIVE INITIATIVES

As the leading Central Ohio resource for the adults who most impact our children, Action for Children has spent decades advocating for and addressing the issues parents and caregivers, child care providers, and educators confront regularly. Action for Children continues to lead the charge, to be there for our child care heroes through any—and every—challenge.

Since the pandemic hit, child care providers lost staff, clients, and income; shouldered rigorous safety measures and higher risks and costs; and many had no alternative but to shut down for good. Parents—mostly women were forced to leave their jobs to care for children full-time. Action for Children is working to confront the child care crisis with the full weight of our expertise and experience. In addition to the consistent supports we already offer, we are undertaking four bold initiatives that will close the gaps in the existing child care landscape and advance it for the future.

Initiative 1: We will make the balancing act of raising young children easier by giving parents and caregivers access to tools, resources, and supports. We will extend our outreach efforts to help educate more parents about the importance of the earliest days in their children's lives. We'll offer easy-to-implement advice for enhancing common activities with learning experiences. And we'll help parents understand how to navigate processes and steps for transitioning their children to kindergarten, opening the path to education for all.

Initiative 2: We will help child care providers hone their business skills, so they have the knowledge to run efficient, profitable, and stable enterprises. This initiative is designed to foster savvy owners, managers, and administrators through training, small-group cohorts, and expert coaching. By partnering with providers, Action for Children mitigates the pressures of trying to run a business independently. Providers can turn to us as a trusted resource to learn how to maintain their child care facility at a level that allows them to earn, save, and compensate employees well; and weather operational challenges like those the pandemic caused. Most importantly, when providers have the business side of their operations running smoothly, they have more time to focus on delivering high-quality services, retaining valuable staff members, and increasing enrollment.

Initiative 3: We will expand our coaching program to provide early learning educators with the latest training and information, so they're always at the forefront of the field. Through coaching, educators will learn research-based practices and approaches that expand the tools they can use to inspire and enrich young minds. Our coaching program takes place in the classroom, making it immediate and convenient for educators, and focuses on specific issues—such as behavior management, math, classroom organization, and more—customized to the children and programs with which educators work. As coaching progresses, we will help them refine their skills with assessments, building their professional capabilities at every stage.

Initiative 4: We will launch a tool that tracks child care in our seven-county service area, so our community can understand current conditions in the early learning landscape. Action for Children has a rich and complex set of administrative, survey, and caseload data, already used by families, employers, and civic leaders to stay up to date and guide child care decisions. Our index will build on our existing assets by collecting extensive data on enrollment, employment, pricing, and financial status, allowing us to develop better insights, anticipate trends, and identify local child care needs. Likewise, the index will deepen the level of statistically significant information we can share with the legislators, nonprofit partners, civic leaders, and advocates who make policy and practical decisions that affect our children.

Each of these bold initiatives brings us closer to a child care system in which every parent, caregiver, provider, and educator has the support, resources, and tools they need to create high-quality early learning experiences.

These new initiatives are additions to Action for Children's services. While we've tested that these initiatives yield positive results in special projects with national partners such as MDRC, and the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, now is the time to fully implement these solutions to scale right here in Central Ohio. That means we need your contributions to fund and launch them. Just as we undertake these plans to protect and evolve child care for our community, it will take the combined effort of our community to advance our efforts.

Responding to the Child Care Crisis

We have adapted our services and extended our outreach, quickly responding to changing circumstances and emerging issues in our community.

Action for Children prioritized keeping providers up to date and in business. From the onset of the pandemic, we helped programs navigate state mandates and reopen. And we addressed the many complications COVID-19 posed, compiling useful information and guidance about maintaining safety and hygiene, communicating with parents, obtaining vaccines, and receiving Hero Pay and other relief funding.

Action for Children insisted that child care be a priority in the state's testing and vaccination plans during the pandemic. We rallied our community to ask Congress for dedicated flexible funding to keep child care providers open and to fuel their recovery. When local government developed plans in 2020 and again in 2021 to use relief funding to address child care, it turned to Action for Children for help because of our authentic relationships with providers, families, and our data.

Action for Children has always kept reliable data on programming, but the pandemic called for more immediate information about the community and the challenges facing child care programs and the families and businesses that rely on them. We launched an ongoing statistically reliable survey of Central Ohio providers — the only one of its kind in Ohio to understand current conditions in local child care. The critical data and qualitative feedback we received then informed our recommendations to policy and decision makers. We also used this information to refine our services, as well as to drive advocacy and tools to best support child care programs in crisis, which resulted in more than \$30 million in local investment since the July 2020.



Over the last five decades of Action for Children's work with parents, families, early childhood educators, and child care programs, we have seen first-hand that child care is essential. That's exactly why we will continue to offer consistent supports for all the adults who nurture, care for, and educate children. When these heroes have what they need, they have the ability to positively impact Ohio's youngest—and our entire community.



For Nurturing Parents and Caregivers

Action for Children regularly expands and improves our services for parents and caregivers, so that they can care for children in ways that are positive, responsive, effective, and enriching.


Action for Children began in 1972 as a Central Ohio nonprofit resource and referral agency to assist parents and caregivers with finding child care in our area. We continue to fulfill this important role so adults have greater access to high-quality, affordable child care and early learning programs that meet their needs and encourage their children's growth.

Over the years, we've extended our services to offer parents and caregivers a wide range of supports that help them nurture their children. Our advice, tools, and guidance are specific both to the parent—whether they're pregnant, a single mom or dad, or juggling work and child care—and to the child—whether they're an infant or transitioning into kindergarten, elementary and beyond.

Every day, Action for Children stands with parents and caregivers, offering them the resources they need to be their children's first and best teachers, including:

- Access to tools and resources to enhance at-home learning
- Access to child care scholarships
- Kindergarten-readiness programs and support services
- Home visitation programs to assist parents at every stage, from pregnancy through their children's school entry
- Tools and advice for choosing quality child care
- Workshops and group sessions to enrich parenting skills
- Classes specific to separated or divorced parents
- FatherUp programs that focus on the role fathers play in their children's lives
- Resources for parents working with legal or social services

Action for Children serves providers and educators of all kinds and sizes, including those in school districts, child care facilities, and family child care homes. Because providers work with children from different age groups, neighborhoods, and with diverse needs, Action for Children tailors our support and services so they're simple for professionals in any situation or zip code to access and implement. With personalized assistance, providers and educators can focus on doing what they do best: caring for and inspiring Ohio's children.

By serving as a reliable resource and advocate for providers and educators, we help them pursue success in their day-to-day and long-term goals through:

- Tools and training for starting and managing a child care program
- Quality-improvement coaching to help providers elevate curriculum, assessment, and classroom instruction
- Professional development opportunities across a range of topics and formats
- A high-quality program, coaching, and scholarships leading to a national Child Development Associate (CDA) Credential
- Incentive payments for increased quality ratings and serving families during non-traditional hours
- Technical assistance and training to maintain and increase their Step Up To Quality star rating
- A bi-monthly forum for providers to learn from each other and guests about current issues that affect them most


Advocacy Timeline

We listen carefully to the parents and professionals we serve in order to understand the factors that influence child care delivery: how racial, geographic, and income inequities can affect parents' access to quality care; how technical and training hurdles can impact providers; and how our education system can better support children's growth. Armed with this information, we use it to inform and influence the decisions of elected officials, policymakers, and other child advocates. Our data-driven approach reinforces the importance of access to affordable, quality child care and early learning—so all of Ohio's children have the opportunity for a strong start.

Likewise, we share our research with parents, caregivers, providers, and educators. We invite them to back policies that focus on finance reform, quality early learning environments, positive parenting, family child care provider supports, and worthy wages for the early childhood workforce.

To extend our knowledge and reach, Action for Children partners with other organizations both in Ohio and across the country to impact the child care system, women's ability to work and earn, and public funding for high-quality early childhood programming.

By expanding awareness and leading actions around issues that impact our children, we rally the community to ensure that Ohio's youngest receive the high-quality experiences they deserve.





For Transformed Communities


Positive early childhood experiences foster happy, healthy, kindergarten-ready children. But the benefits don't stop there. High-quality care and education have the potential to transform our entire community.

excellent early learning experiences with responsive, sensitive caregivers are more likely to be successful in school, college, and life. They are less likely to receive remedial education services, be involved with the court system, or drop out of school, and they are more likely to do well on achievement tests, maintain a job, and stay married. Benefits even appear to extend to the next generation. Yet we also know that all children don't start out with the same advantages. More than one in four children live in poverty, with even higher rates in Central Ohio's rural areas and among Black and brown children. By supporting quality child care and early education among under-resourced communities, Action for Children helps level the playing field in two ways: First, a person who completes college or a skilled trade school will be more likely to land a job that pays a better-than-living wage. In turn, their lifetime earning potential increases, allowing them to save and pass down wealth to their children—which, in turn, ends a cycle of intergenerational poverty.

Second, when parents can access and afford child care, they're better able to pursue their career. In fact, when child care is more available, more parents, particularly moms, stay in or re-enter the workforce. Whether they're providing for their family independently or along with a partner's income, parents who can pursue careers can also pursue improved quality of life and resources for their children.


In these ways, Action for Children's work has the potential to address issues that go beyond child care and education, contributing to widespread social change for our entire area.





Spreading Equity

One of the consequences of **Action for Children's work** is its impact on the women who comprise the majority of child care providers. By serving businesses that are primarily owned and operated by women, 28% of whom are women of color, and fostering their professional well-being, we help them grow the financial success of their businesses. Supporting these professionals is how we break down wage inequities between women and men, and between people of color and their white counterparts.
