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Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP)

The Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) reimburses Family Child Care professionals for the nutritious meals and snacks they serve to children in their care. This child care food program is a great way for providers to earn back the money they spend feeding children, and for children to get the nutritious food they need to thrive.



Family Child Care participants in the CACFP are required to attend at least one Action for Children sponsored CACFP Annual Training session per USDA fiscal year. Topics will include a review of and any updates to CACFP policies and procedures as well as other useful topics, such as menu planning, record-keeping tips and tricks, and nutrition education.

Trainings are offered once per month April-Aug. and the last two trainings are offered in Sept. Trainings in 2024 are offered live via Zoom. Trainings are held on a variety of times and days of the week to accommodate schedules. These trainings are not OA approved and do not have a fee.

CACFP Onboarding Trainings

Scheduled 2-3 times per month on-demand/as-needed. This training is usually one-on-one or in a small group setting and typically takes place live via Zoom. An onboarding training is required for any Family Child Care provider wishing to participate in the CACFP with Action for Children. The training will cover all CACFP policies and procedures as well as other useful topics, such as menu planning, record-keeping tips and tricks, and nutrition education. To enroll in the CACFP, FCC providers must have an active Type A or Type B license and have at least one daycare child enrolled in their program.
