



The Franklin County RISE Program is committed to every child's educational success. Research shows that 90% attendance in early learning programs sets children up for lifelong academic achievement. This policy outlines attendance expectations and support systems to help families and providers meet this goal while being mindful of challenges faced by marginalized communities.

**Attendance Expectation:**

Families are expected to maintain at least 90% attendance during the scholarship period to support their child's learning. Child care providers are expected to actively promote this attendance expectation.

**Support:**

If attendance issues arise, we encourage families and providers to communicate with us so we can offer resources and support to overcome any challenges. Child care providers should engage families in conversations about past attendance challenges and offer solutions or resources.

**Collaboration:**

Providers will report attendance concerns to the Franklin County RISE Program at [RISEHelp@actionforchildren.org](mailto:RISEHelp@actionforchildren.org) when necessary and collaborate on additional support measures to ensure the child's regular attendance.

**Scholarship Review:**

In cases where attendance issues persist despite supportive interventions, a review of the scholarship may be conducted. The goal of the review will be to assess how best to support you moving forward, including potential adjustments to their participation in the program.
